Edith Stein (1891-1942), St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, was born Jewish in Breslau, Germany. She became a teacher, philosopher, phenomenologist, feminist, and translator. In 1922, she was baptized into the Roman Catholic Church. Unable to continue as a professor under the Nazi rule, she joined the Discalced Carmelites in 1933. In 1942, she and her sister Rosa were arrested in Echt, Netherlands. They were killed at Auschwitz on August 9. Edith Stein was canonized in 1998. She is one of the six patron saints of Europe.
